ECS FORMULA

The formula is being phased in through FY 30.

- The formula was revised, and a phase-in schedule established, as part of the FY 18 and FY 19 Budget. Adjustments were made in the FY 22 and FY 23 Budget.
- The phase-in began in FY 19. Towns that are underfunded according to the formula will receive increases annually, and (except in FY 22 and FY 23) towns that are overfunded will receive reductions annually.
- The FY 22 and FY 23 Budget revises the formula and the phase-in schedule.
 - Towns that are underfunded according to the formula will reach full funding in FY 28 as originally planned.
 - Towns that are overfunded will receive, in FY 22 and FY 23, the same grants as in FY 21, and then resume the formula phase-in beginning FY 24. These towns will reach full funding in FY 30.
